March Rock Show

We would like to update everyone regarding some of our results from our 2020 March Gem & Mineral Rock Show.

- 1. Door attendance for Friday was approximately #248 & Saturday was approximately #166, based upon tickets handed out.
- 2. Approximately #188 student handbooks were given out between the two days of the Show (with more on Saturday)
- 3. The Total number would have been estimated at #602 through the doors.
- 4. Even though we were down in attendance all the Dealers were pleased with their results based upon the conditions that we were dealing with.
- 5. The amount income was \$2,517 (less door donations of \$207) & expenses reported to date were \$610 for the two days. The expense amounts will change once outstanding bills are received.
- 6. The show's income for 2020 was reduced 12.52% over 2019, which was down from 2018 numbers.

Identify the "Rock or Mineral"

Last month's rock or mineral:

Pudding Stone







Puddingstone is a conglomerate made up of small pebbles or rocks, in the case of good lapidary material the rocks are usually a form of jasper or agate.

It is formed when conglomerates formed from rocks and pebbles are surround by small sands and silts over the centuries the material got compressed and during the Ice Age bound together forming a solid material. The material surrounding the rocks or pebbles can form as a quartzite, siltstone, or mudstone depending on the smaller material and environment it was deposited in.

In the United States puddingstone fragments of puddingstone can be found across Michigan and to the Drummond Island and can even be found as far south as Kentucky and Ohio due to repeated glacial advances.

I have found large amounts of a variety of puddingstone in southern New Mexico around the Deming New Mexico. The material I have found is a good lapidary material yielding some interesting patterns in cabochons.
